
• *dementia* and *palliative*

- Lack of common overall description of advanced dementia
- Under recognition of the extended palliative phase
- Progressive, 'a trajectory of decline'
- Involves family
- Decision-making

- Anxiety

- Suffering
- Emotional stress
- Co-morbidities
- Social life
