Demographics

- In July 2015, world population = 7.3 billion 12.3% > age 60; 1.7% >age 80
- Globally, 60+ will more than double by 2050 triple by 2100
- In Europe, 24% already 60+; 34% by 2050
- 28% of all people 80+ now live in Europe

Valuing the Invaluable

- In 2013, about **40 million** family caregivers in the U.S. provided care to an adult with limitations in daily activities
- The estimated economic value of their unpaid contributions was about \$470 billion in 2013
 - from an estimated \$450 billion in
 2009

TIME COMMITMENT

Caregivers spend an average of 18 hours per week providing care to a family member.

60% Family caregivers caring for an adult while employed full or part time.

Provide **21+ hours** of family care per week while working a job.

 AARP Public Policy Institute and United Hospital Fund collaborated on **first in-depth national survey** of family caregivers in this area

This report documents:

- What medical/nursing tasks family caregivers do;
- What they find difficult;
- Who trains/guides them; and
- Impact on their quality of life.

Medical/Nursing Tasks

- Managing complex medications (Poly meds, Injections)
- Prepare special food diets
- Wound care
- Changing catheters
- And more...

Recognition and Support from Healthcare Professionals

- Better communication
- More preparation for transitions across settings
- Assessment of the caregivers' needs
 - Rarely are family caregivers asked "How are *you* doing? How are *you* managing?"
- Recognition as "team member"
 - Intimate knowledge of care recipient
 - Acquired care skills
 - Desire to be partners

Higher-Hour Caregivers

- 32% of caregivers are higher-hour
- Provide 21 hours of care/week
- Average = 62
 hours/week
- High burden of care
- Report having "no choice"



Multicultural Family Caregivers

- More likely to be higher-hour
 - Asian American Pacific Islander: 37%
 - African American/Black: 39%
 - Hispanic/Latino: 40%
- Existing gap in research
- Surprisingly little research
- Current methods problematic

CARE Act

- Opportunity for patient to identify a family caregiver to include in the patient- and family- centered care process...in the record
- Notification of discharge
- Teaching/anticipatory guidance for family caregiver expected to perform medical/nursing tasks

CARE Act

- Give support to nurses and other health and social service professionals to do what their professional standards of practice require them to do
- Stimulate new thinking on how to anticipate patient and family questions and pro-actively support them
- Reduce hospital re-admissions

Home Alone Alliance

- Alliance of private, non profit, and academic organizations
- Change the field, change the culture
- Provide quality training videos for family caregivers performing complex tasks

Family Caregiver Training Videos

- Provide training vehicle on medical/nursing tasks
- Audience: Family Caregivers and Nursing Students
- First series focusing on medication management

Working Caregivers Need Help

- 70% who perform medical/nursing tasks reported that caregiving impacted job
- 34% left their job due to lack flexible work hours
- Employers acting to retain experienced workers:
 - Manager training
 - Flexible Time
 - Backup care

Paid Family Leave

- The U.S. has no national paid family leave program
- Three States have a paid family leave program (California, New Jersey, Rhode Island)
- Federal Program for Unpaid Family Leave (FMLA)
 - Most families can't afford to take unpaid leave

Respite

- Lifespan Respite Act
 - -Currently underfunded
 - -Assists family caregivers with access to respite services
 - –Trains and recruits respite workers
 - Enhances coordinated systems of community-based programs

RAISE Family Caregivers Act

- Recognize, Assist, Include, Support and Engage
- Bi-Partisan Senate Bill
- Requires development, maintenance and updating of an integrated national strategy to recognize and support family caregivers by the HHS Secretary

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
